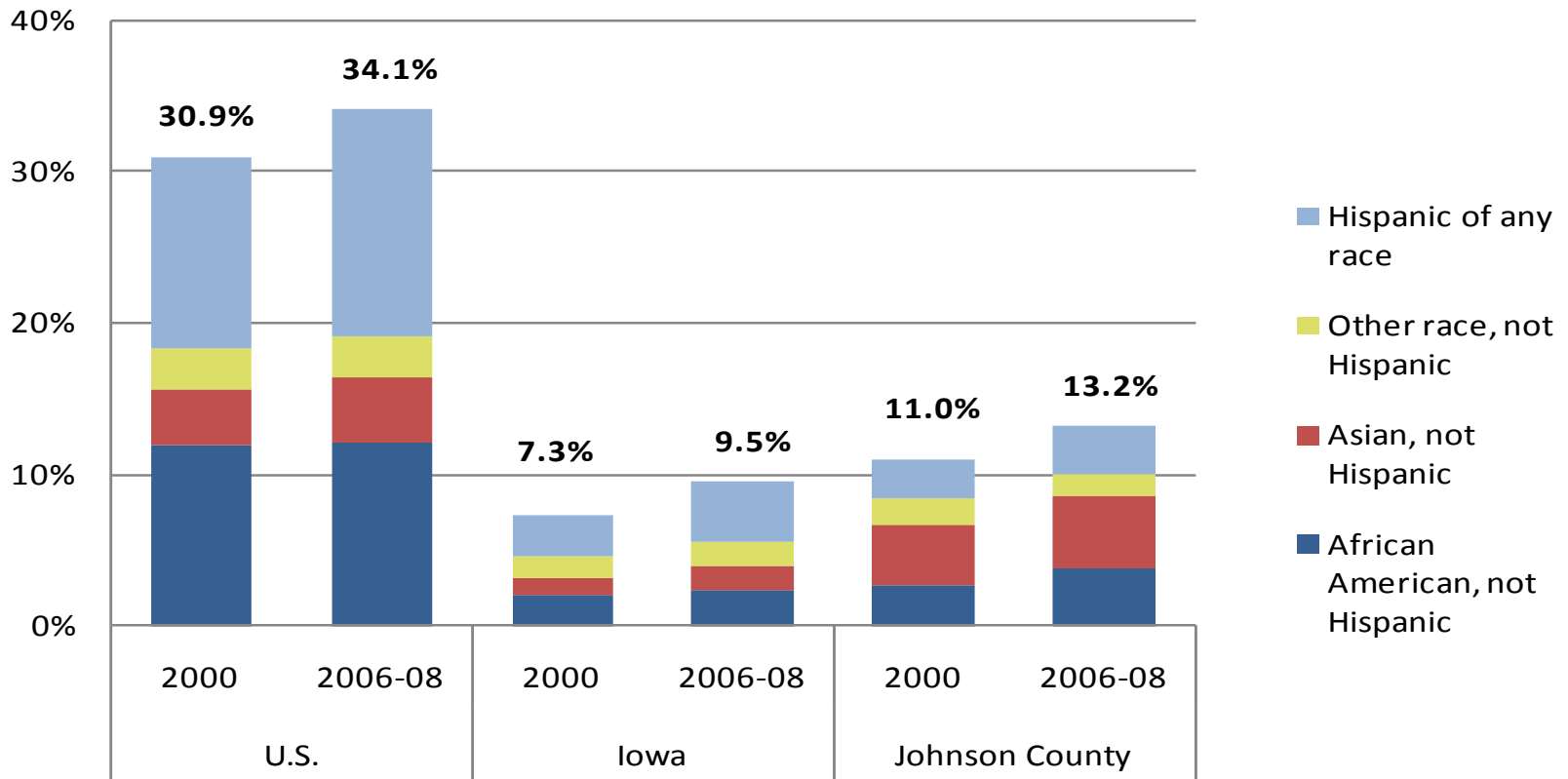

Percent of Population that is Hispanic or Non-white

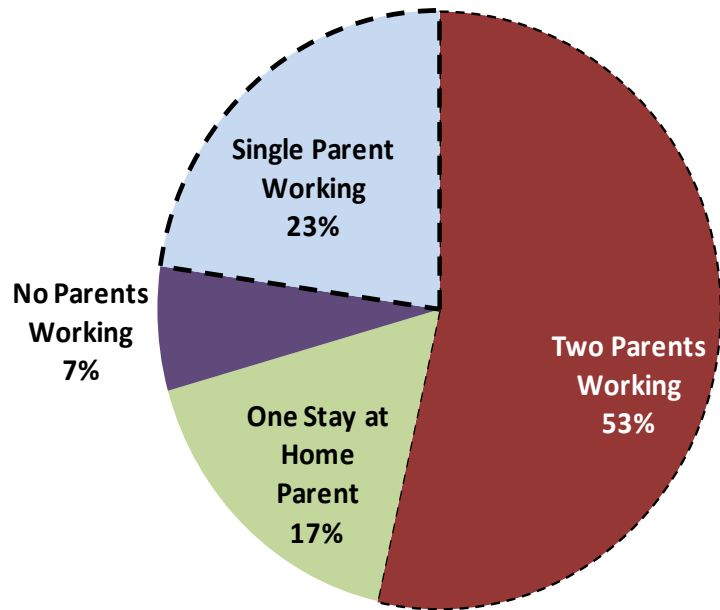

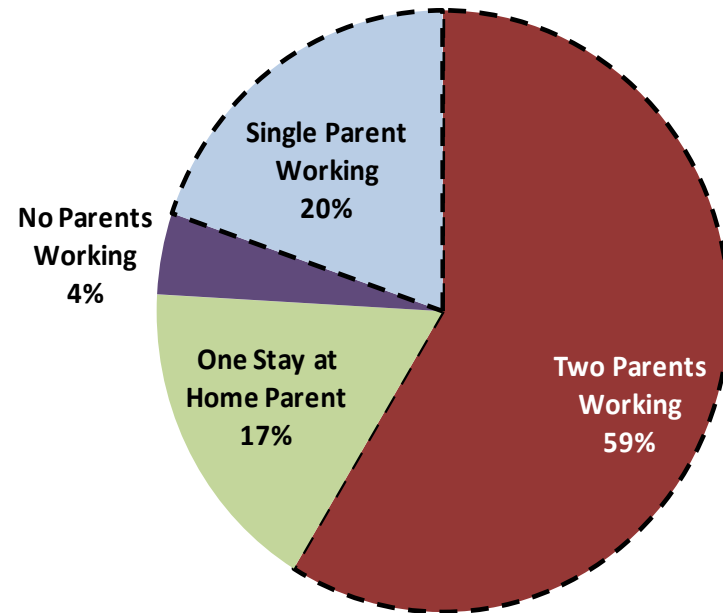


Family Structure and Employment: Presence of Working Parents in Families with Children under Age 18 Living at Home, 2006-08

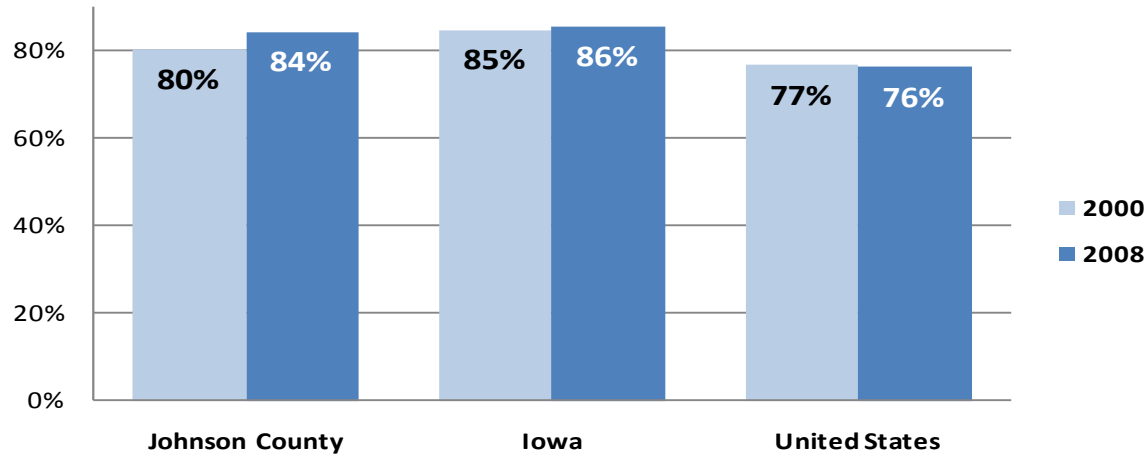

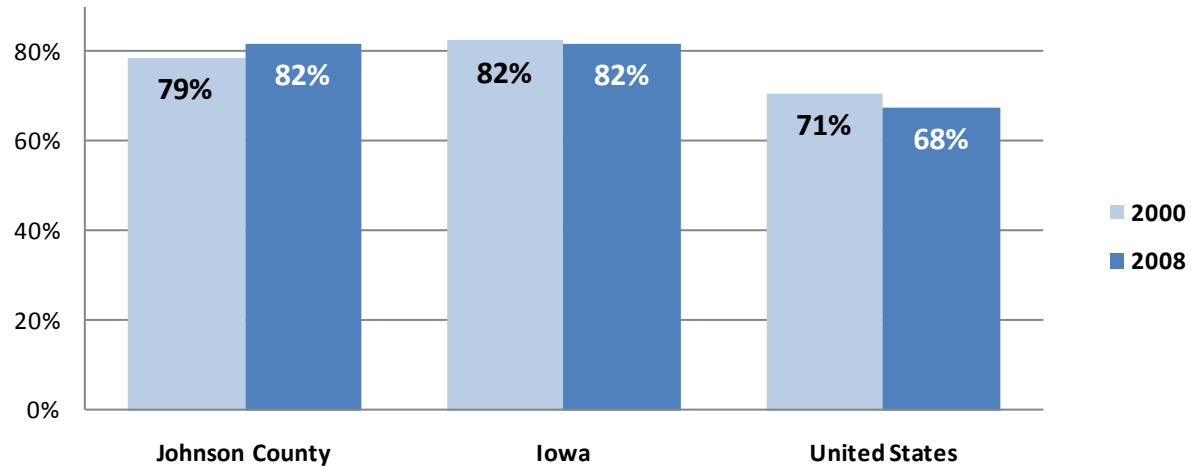

Percent in the Labor Force

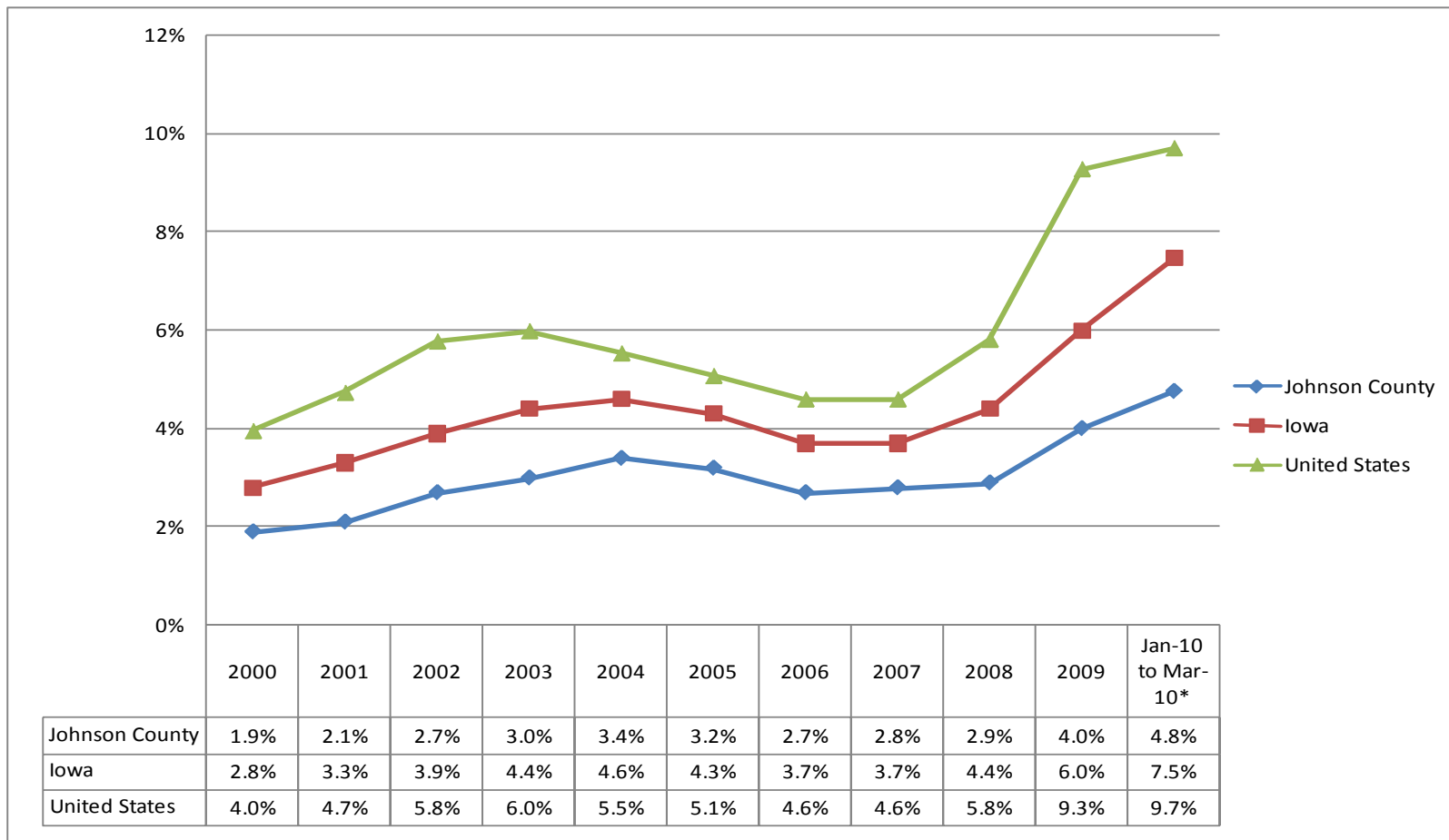

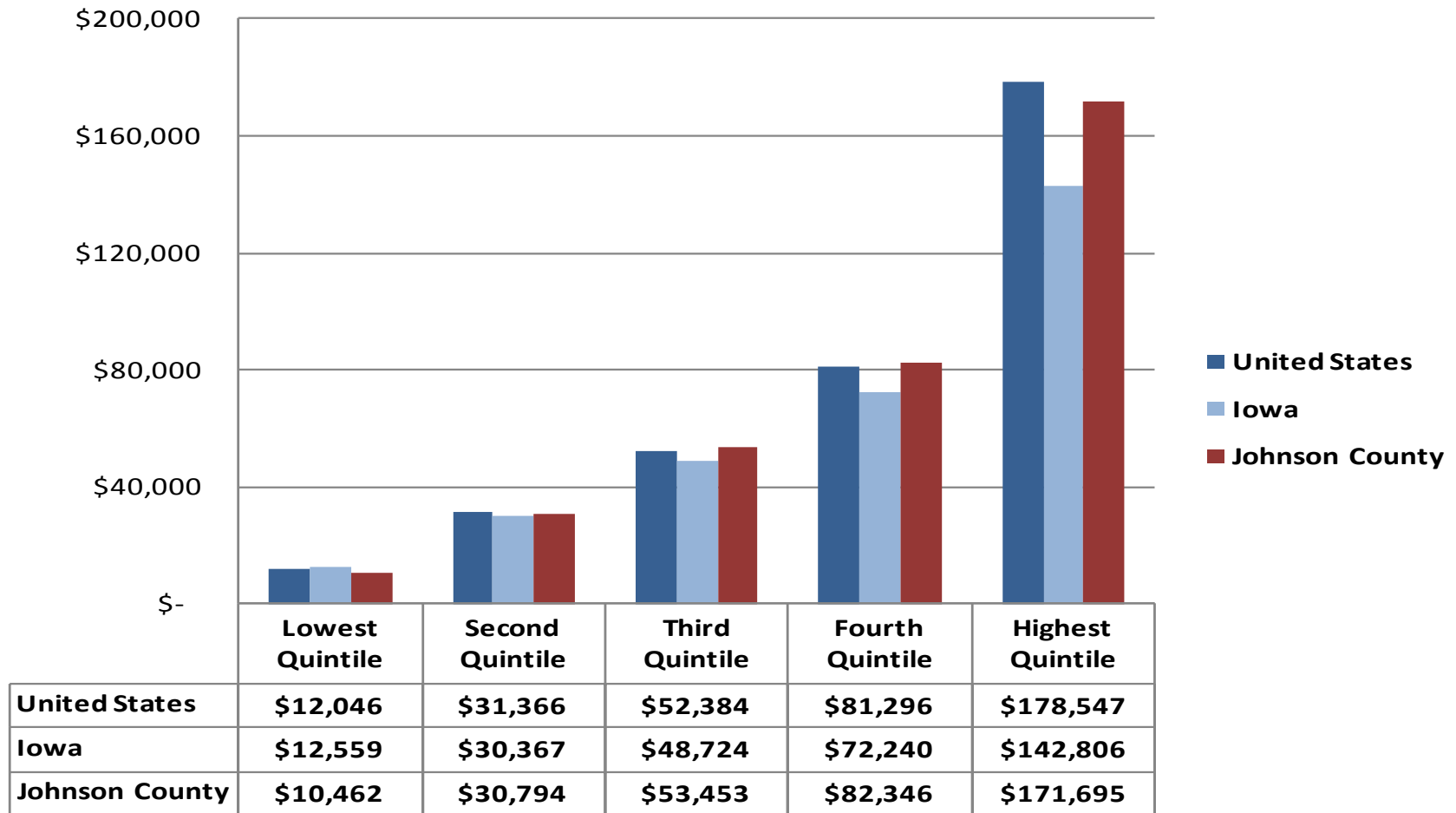

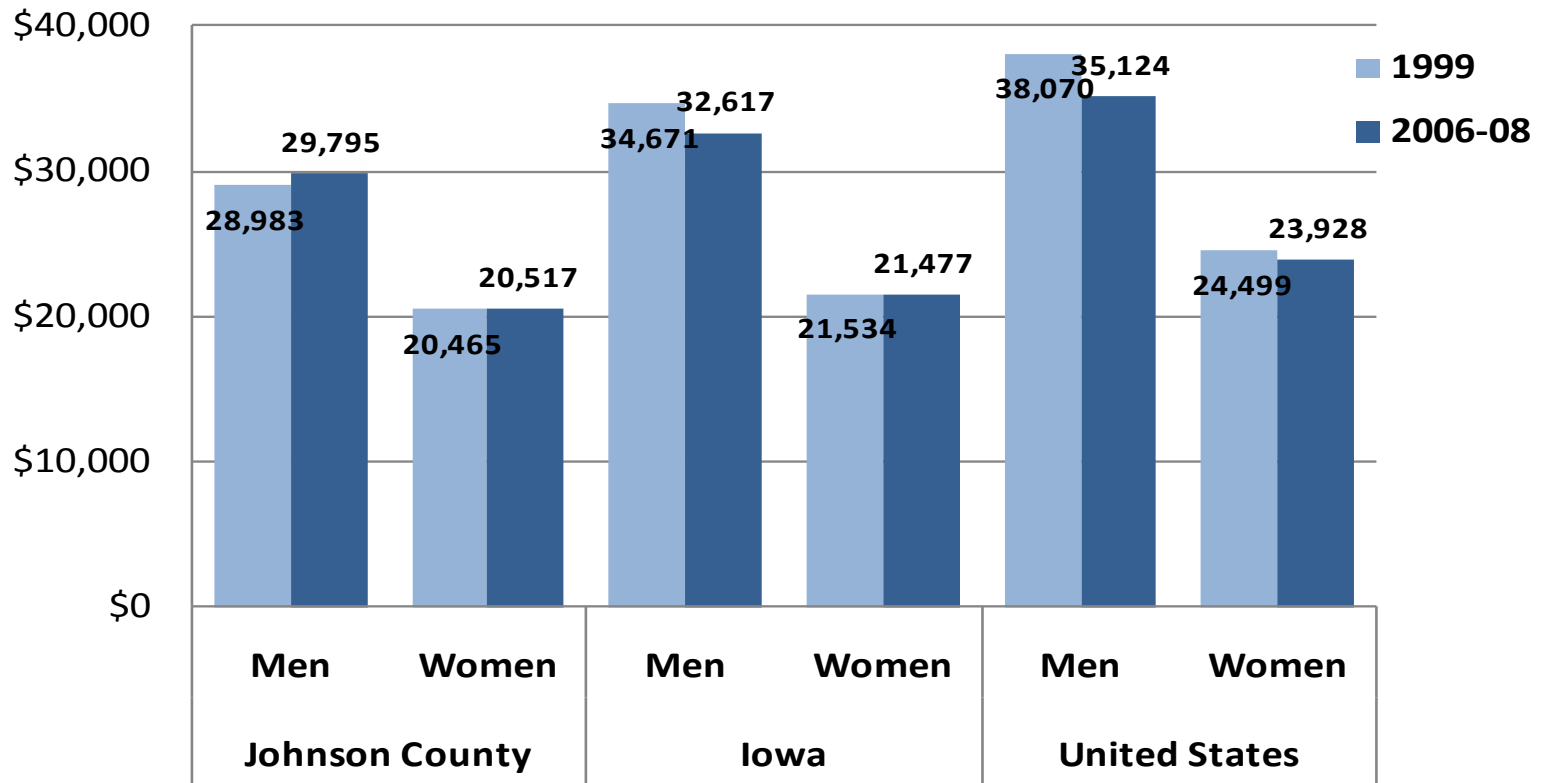
Distribution of Income: Mean Household Income of Income Quintiles, 2006-08

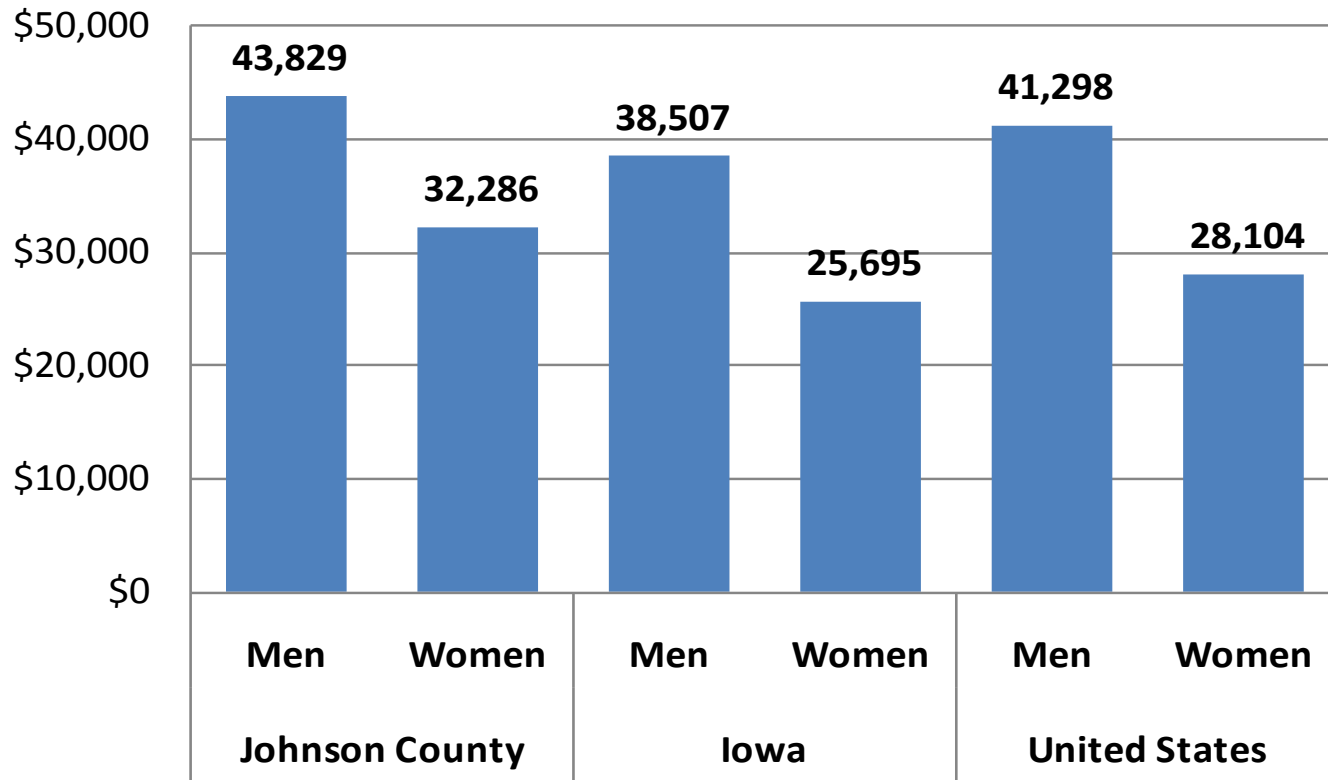
Median Annual Earnings of Workers (in 2008 dollars)

Workers Age 16 and Above

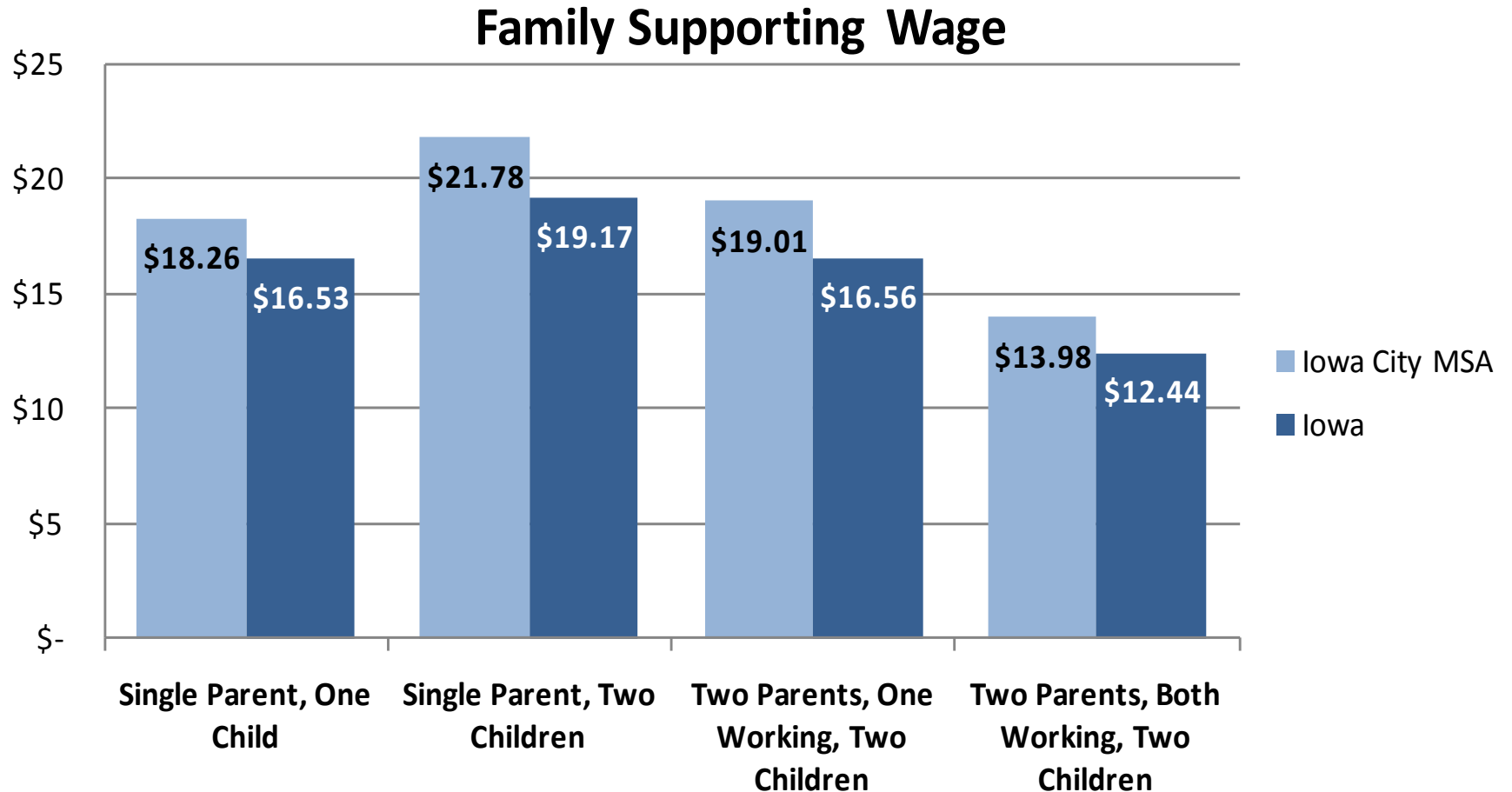


Median Annual Earnings of Workers (in 2008 dollars)

Workers Age 25 and Above, 2006-08



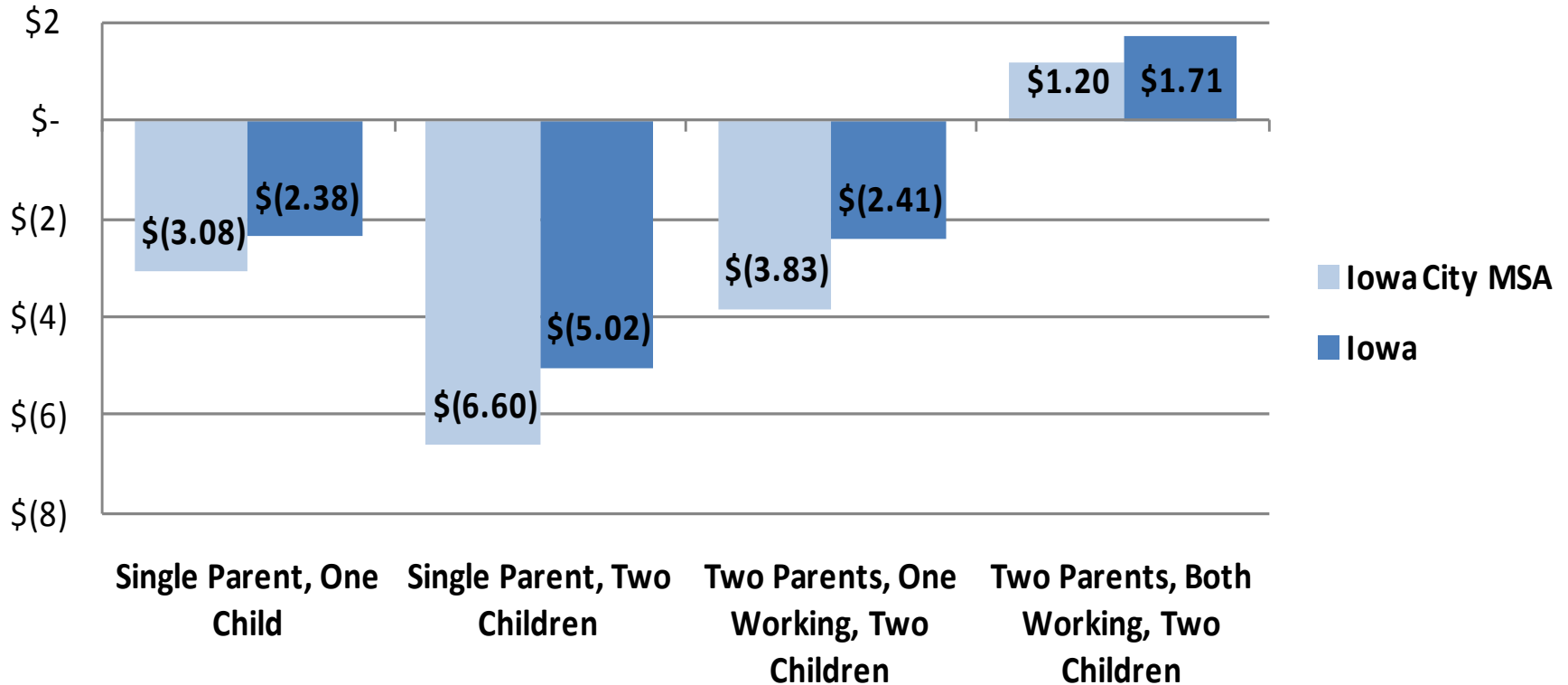
Wages and the Cost of Living, 2008



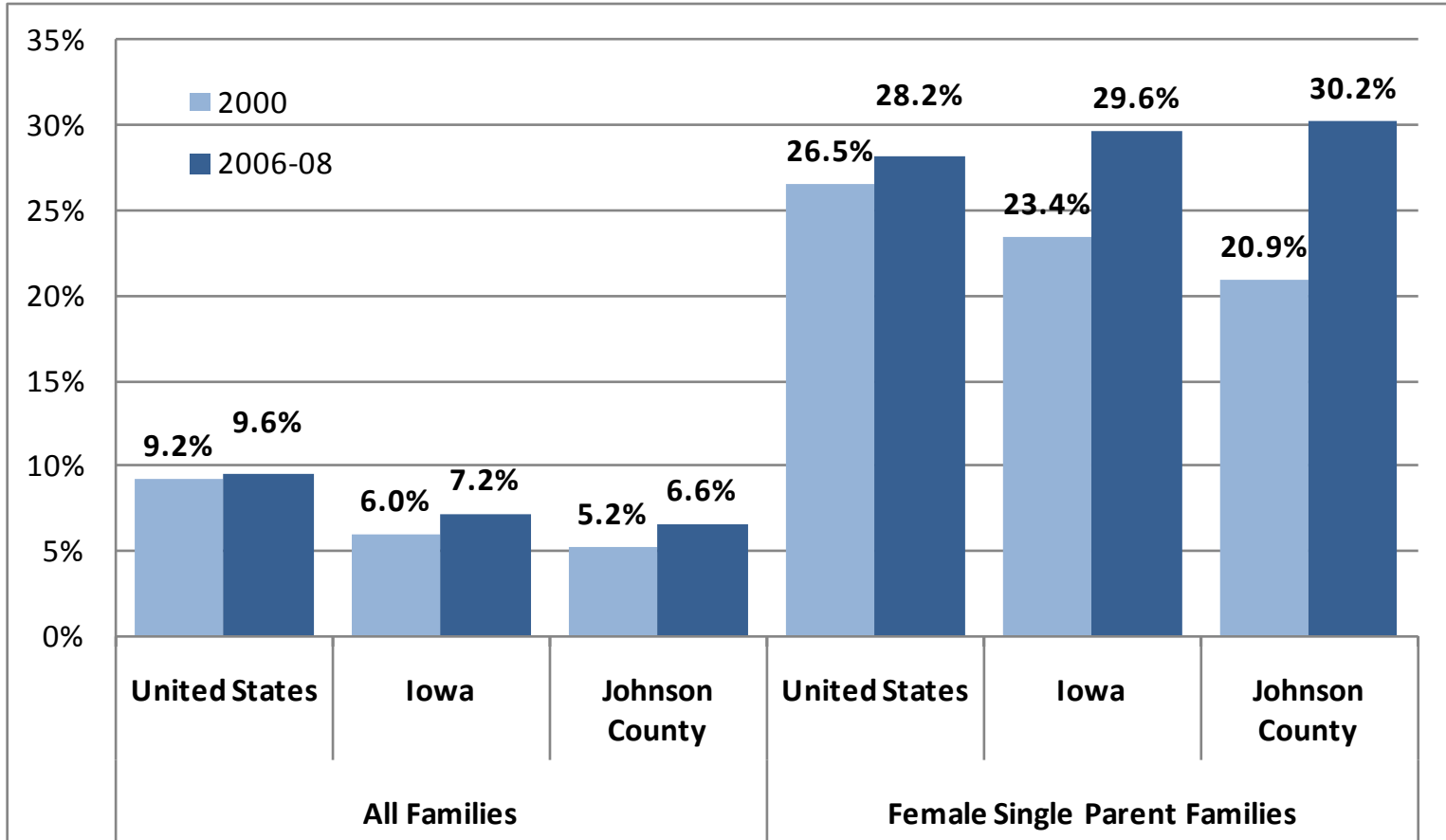

Wage Gap

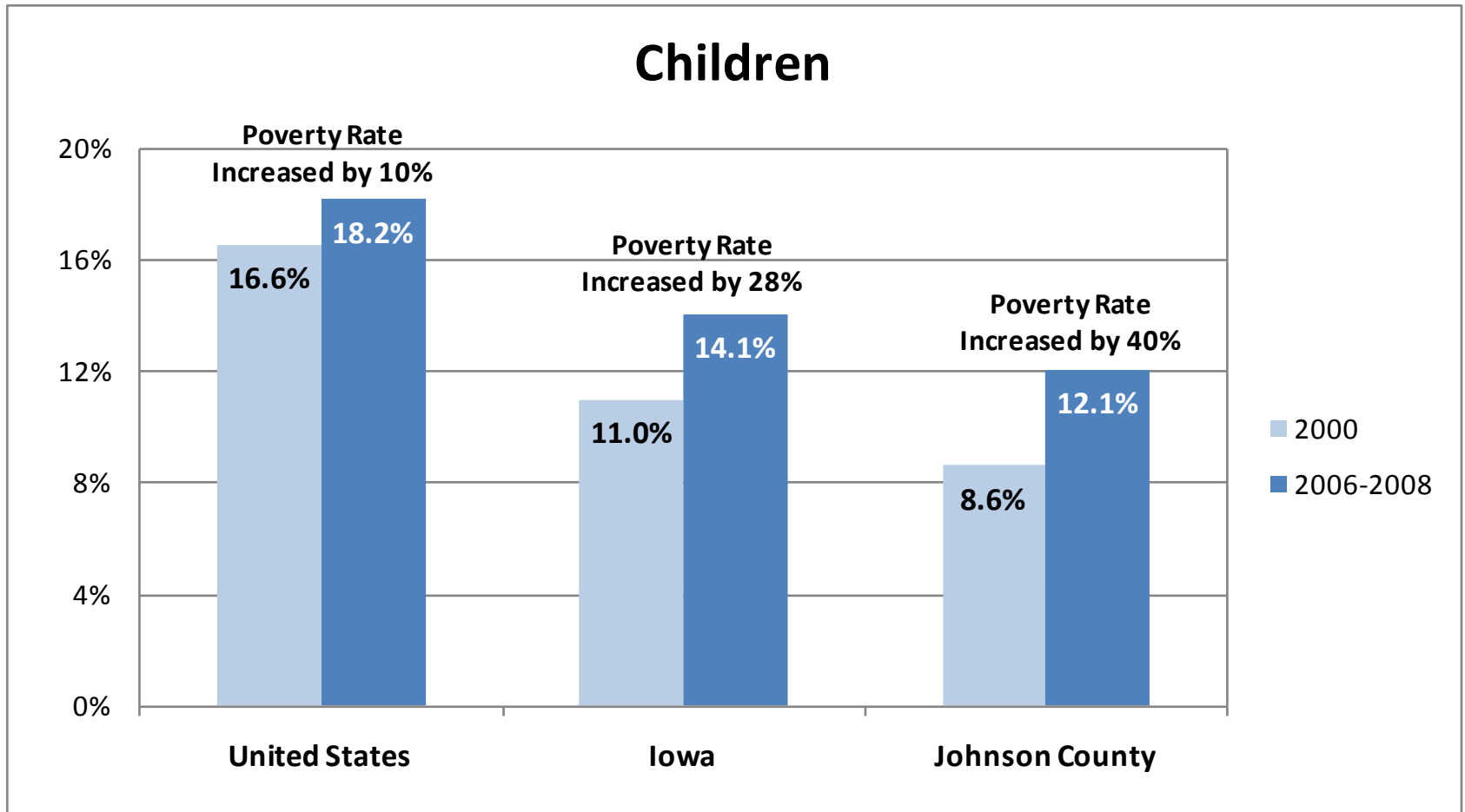


Percent of Families in Poverty

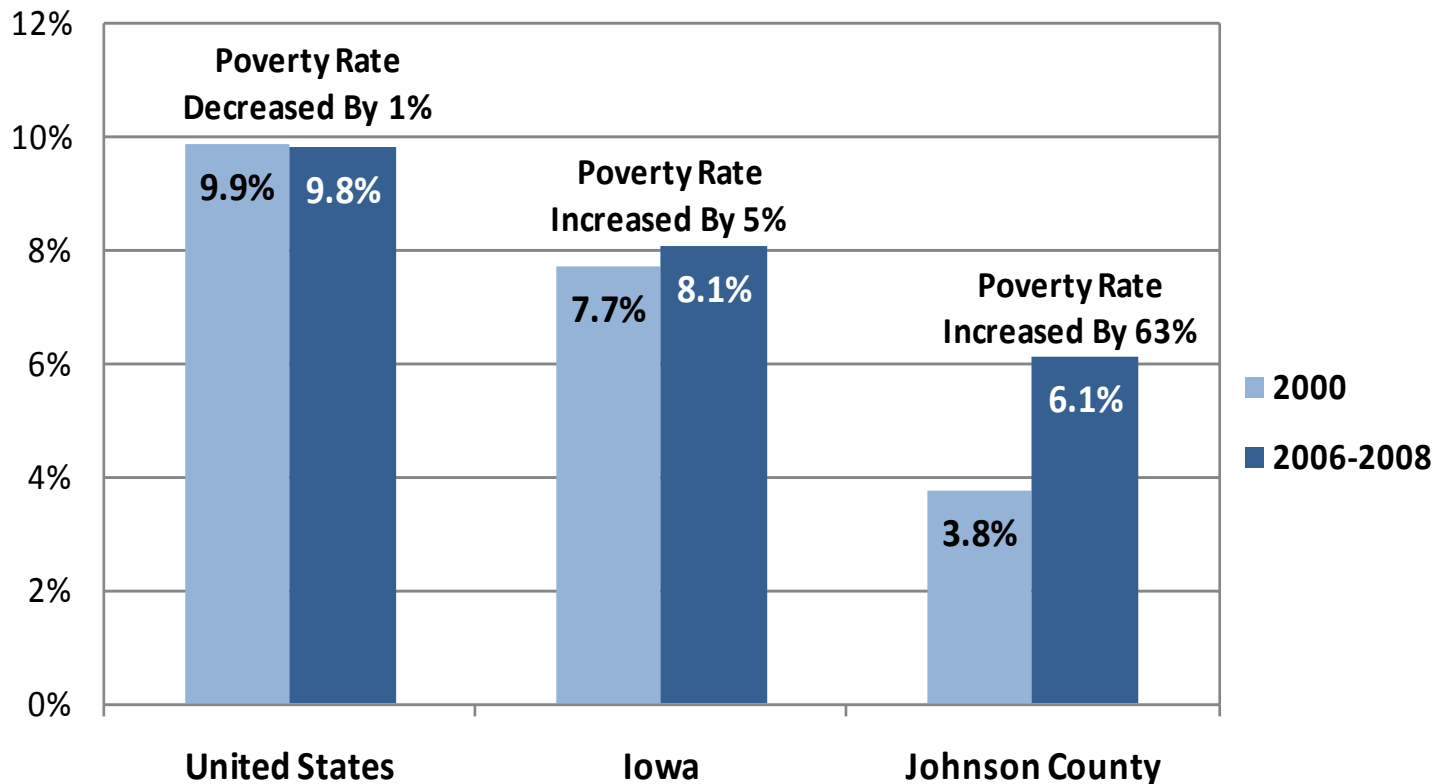
Poverty among Children and Seniors: Percent of Persons in Poverty

Poverty among Children and Seniors: Percent of Persons in Poverty

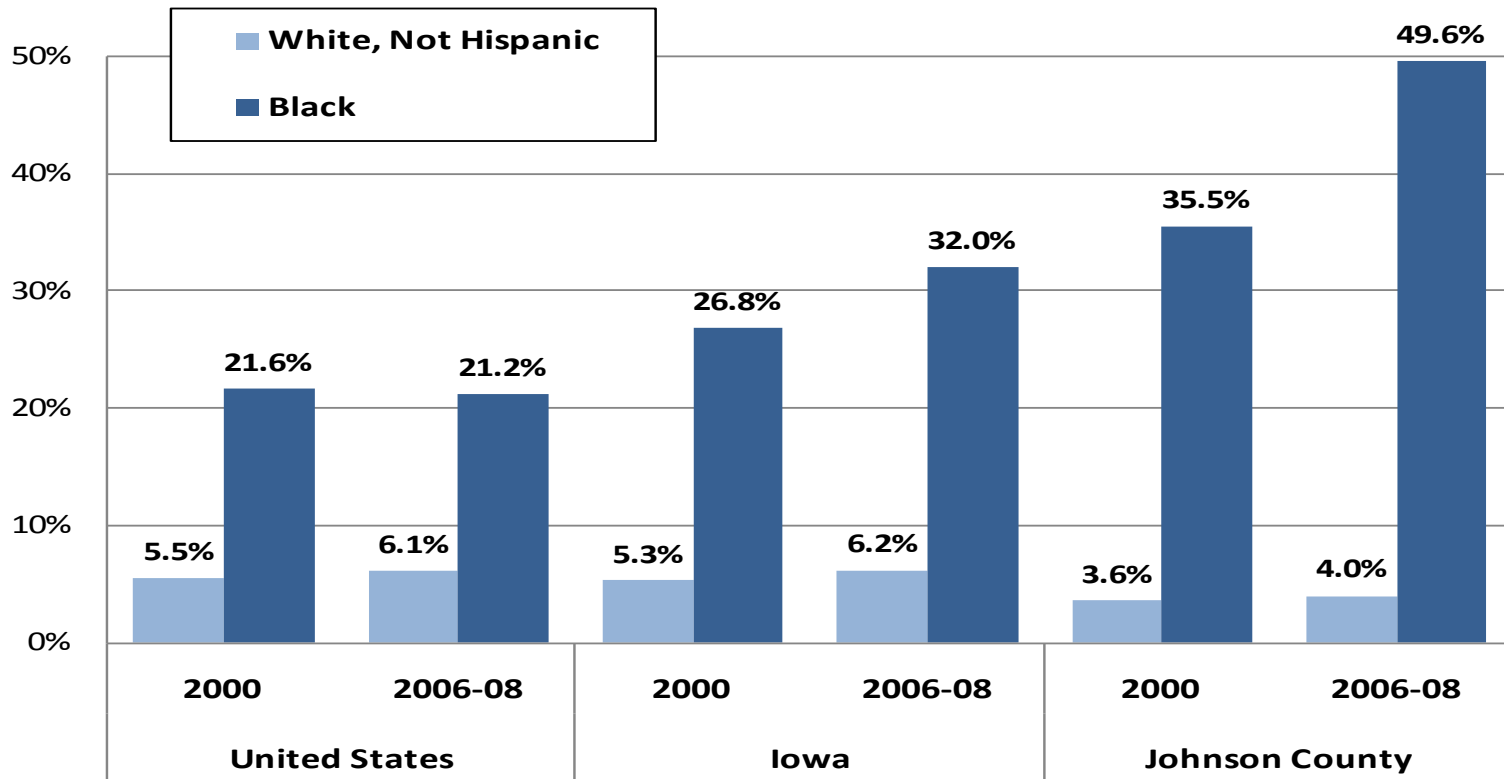

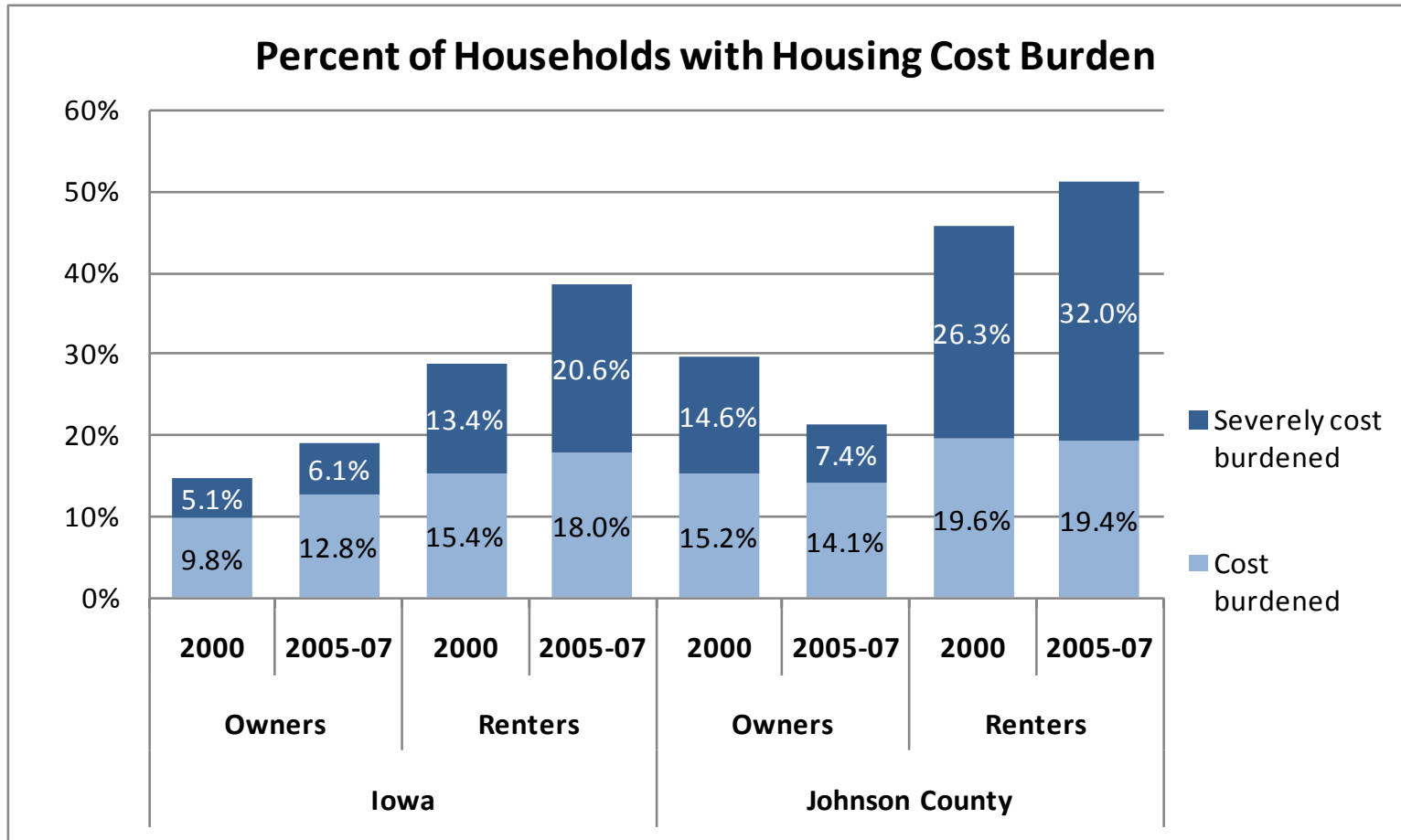

Poverty by Race: Percent of Families in Poverty



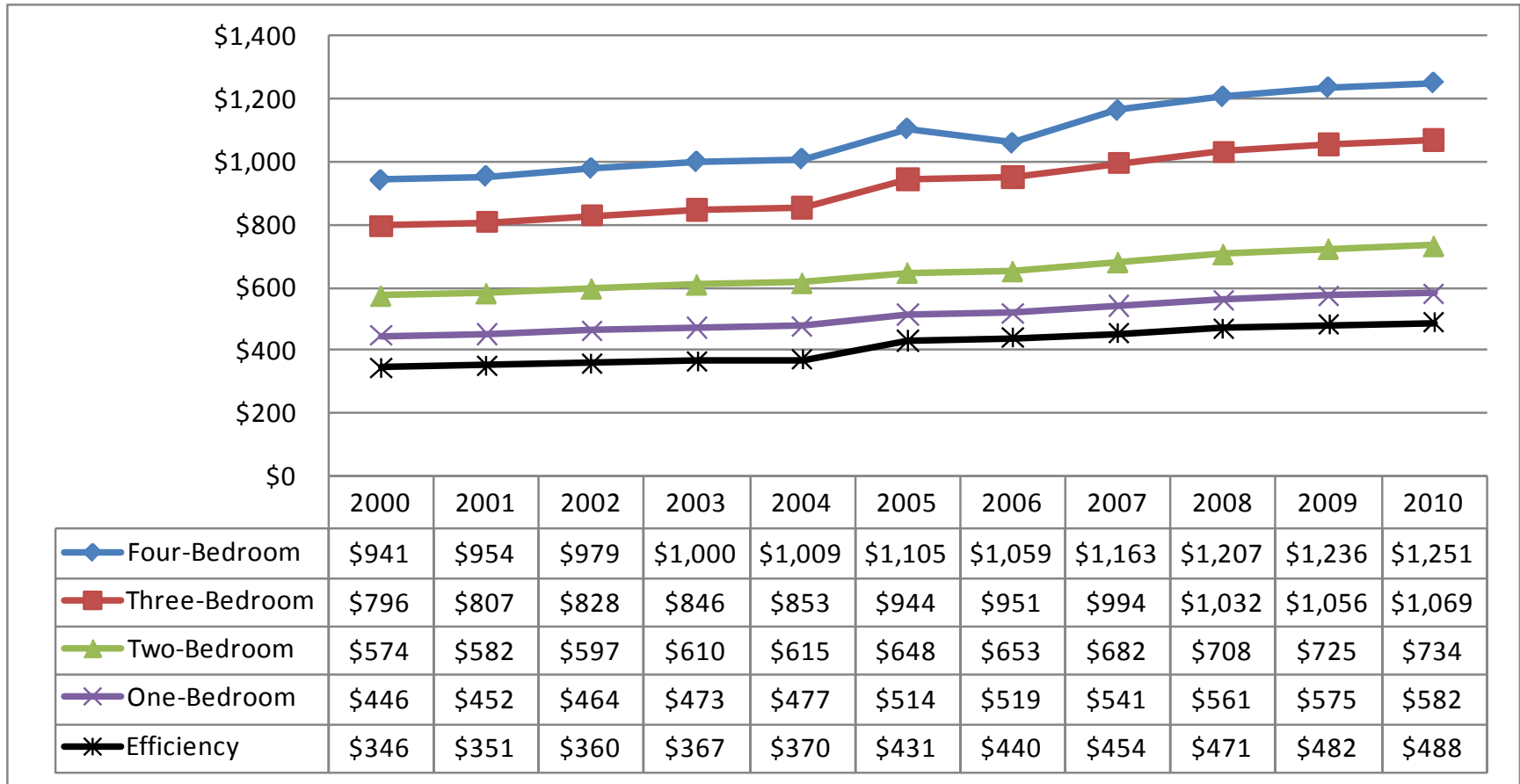

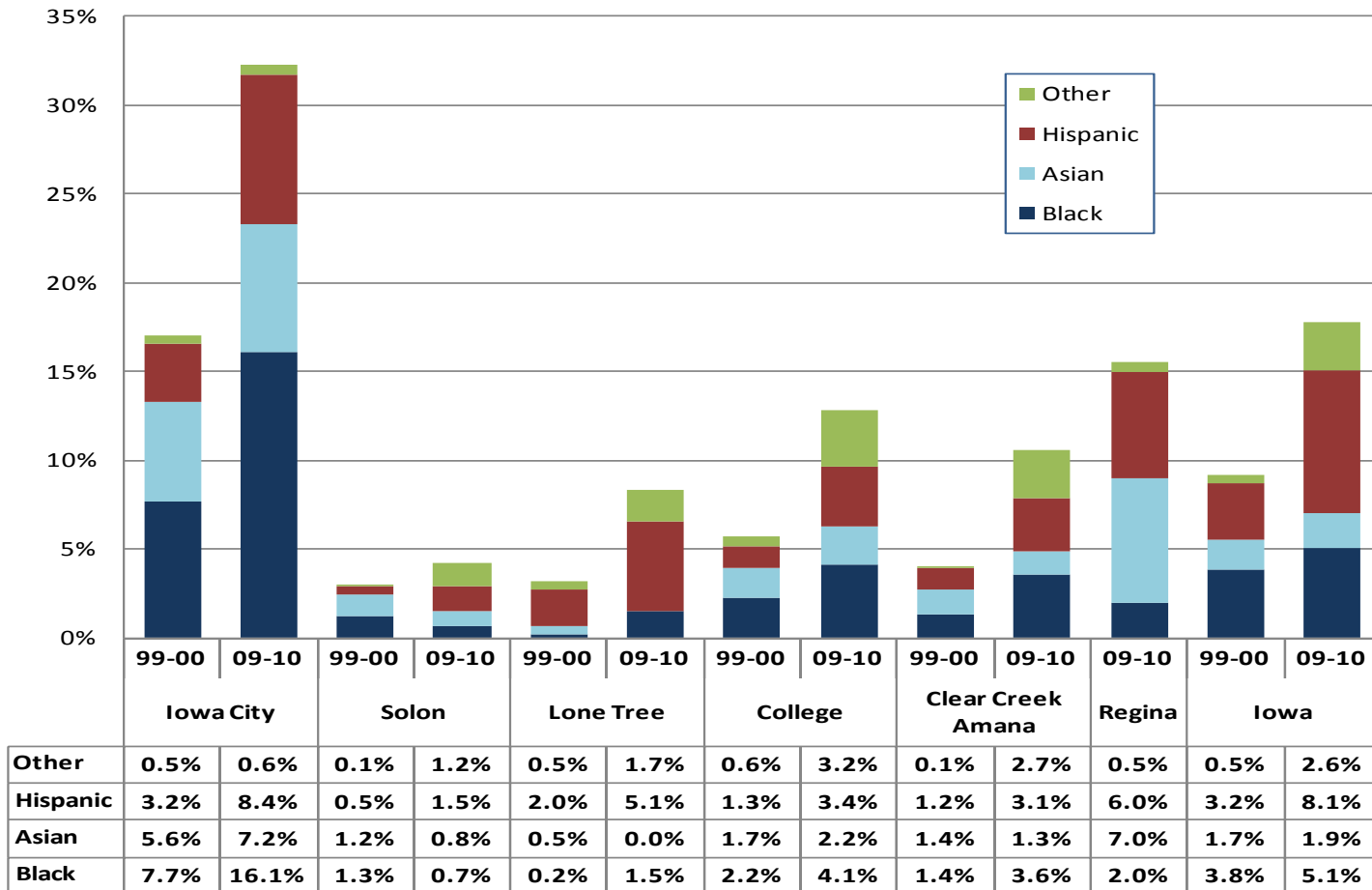

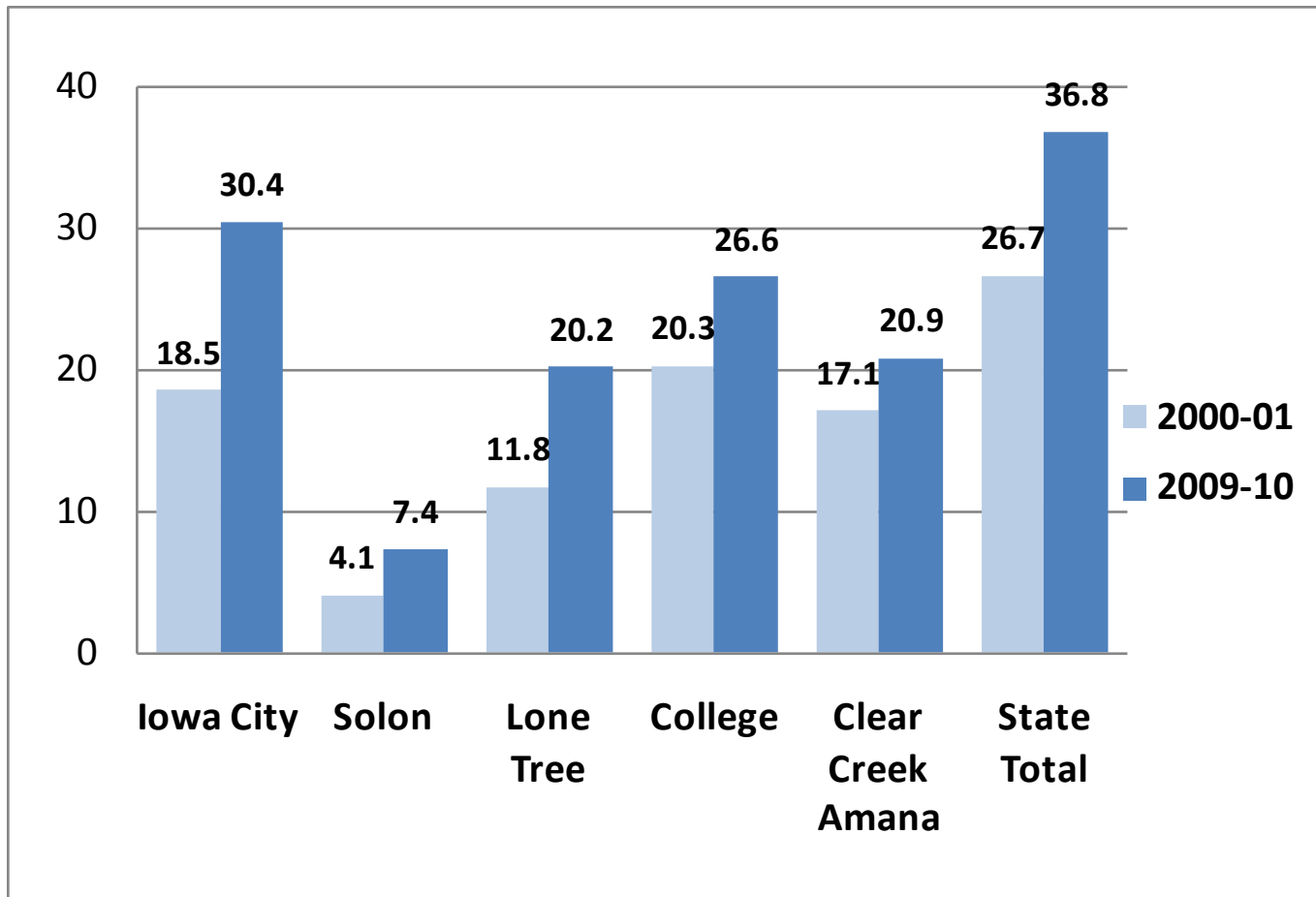


Student Demographics: Minority Students as a Percent of Total Enrollment, Pre-K through 12



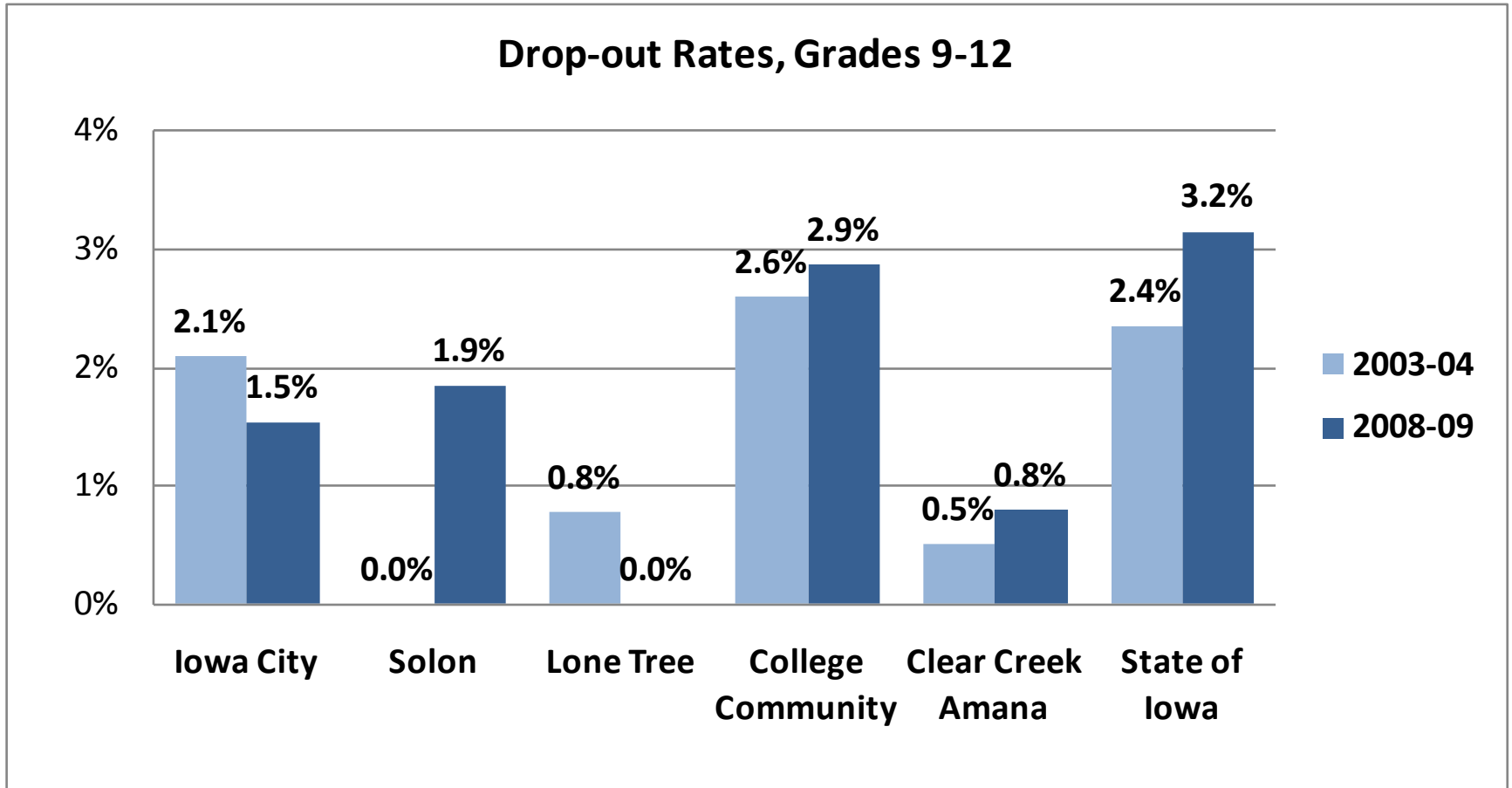

Percent of Students Eligible for Free or Reduced Price School Lunch



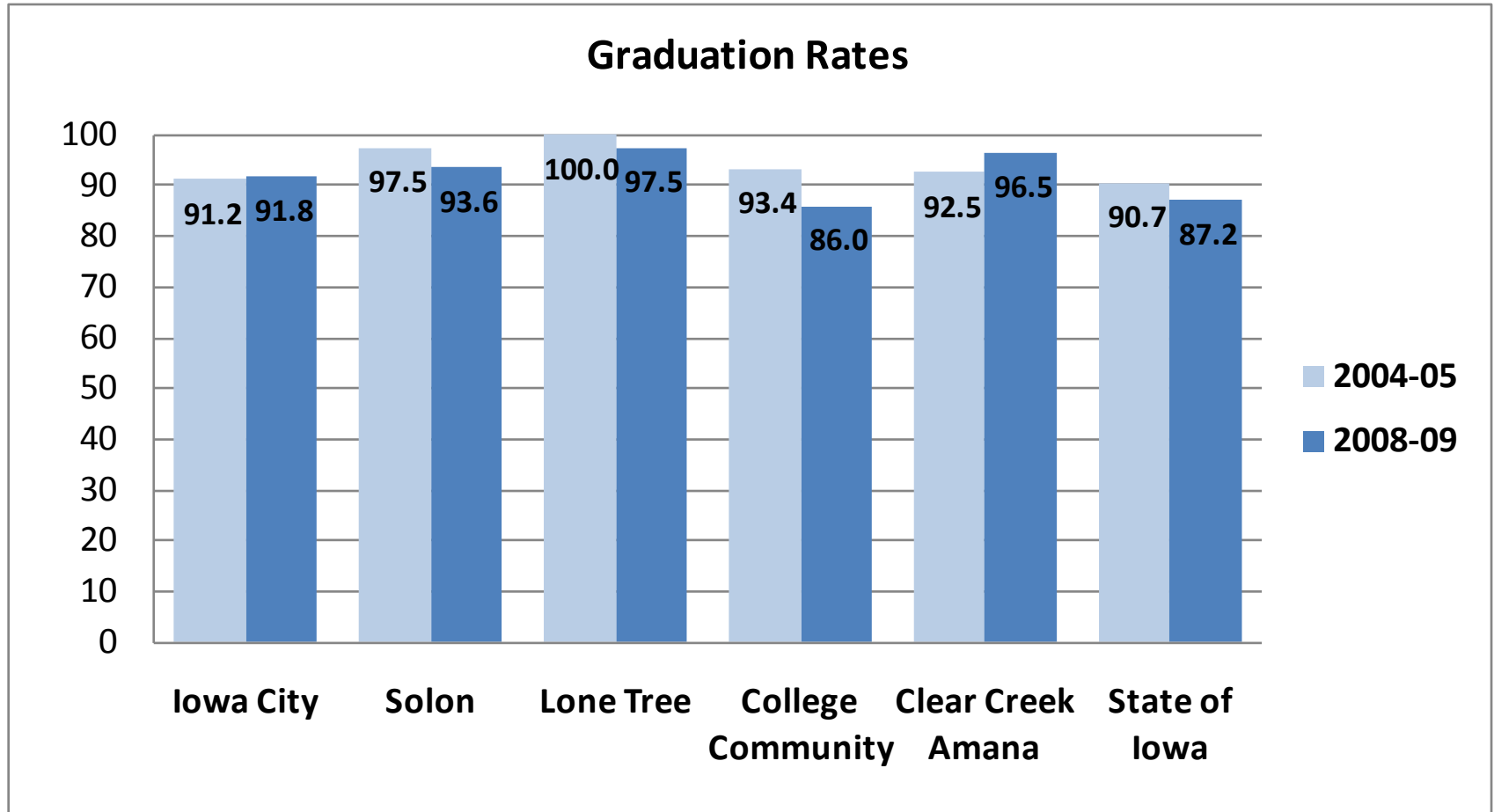

High School Drop-out and Graduation Rates



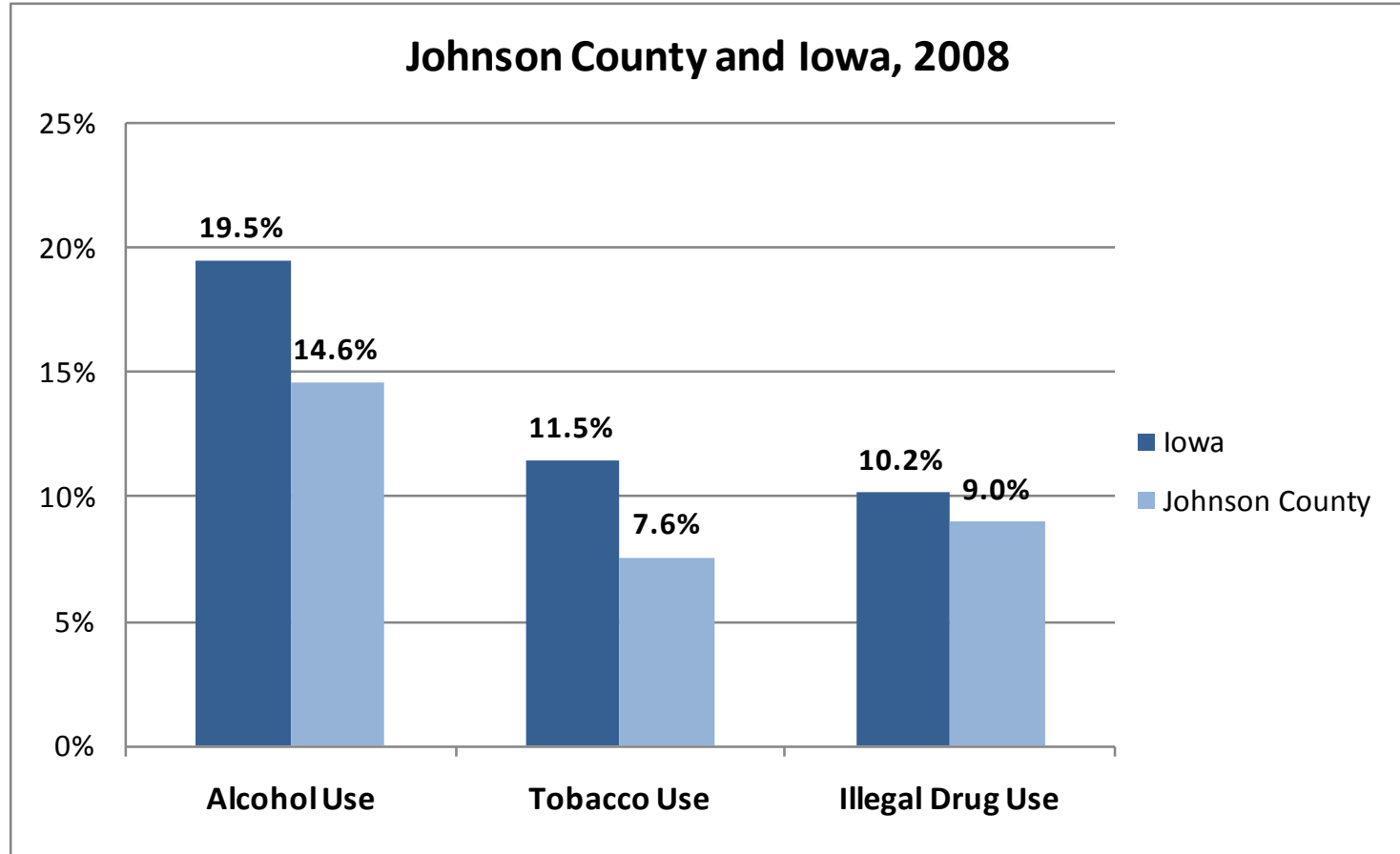

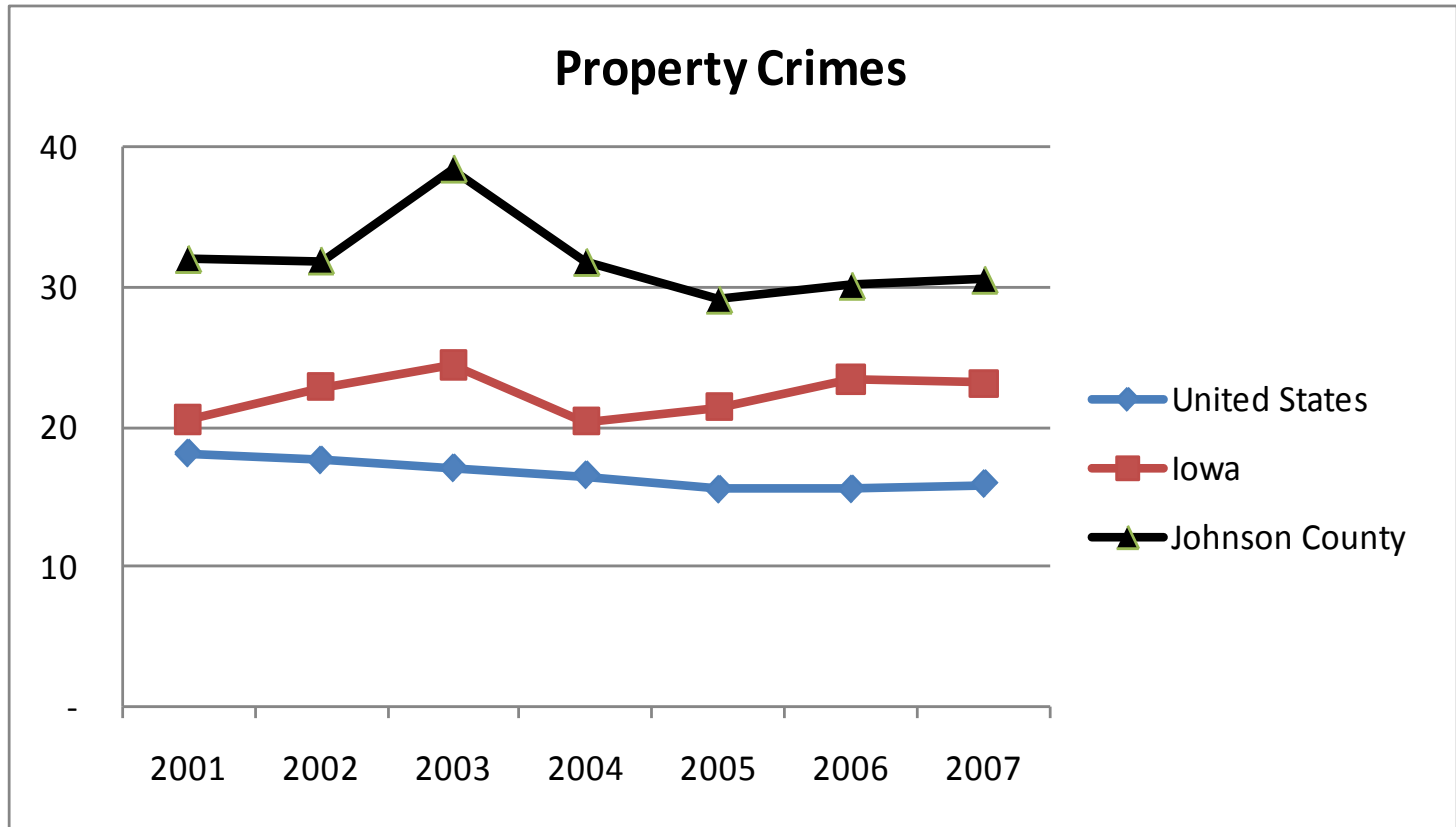

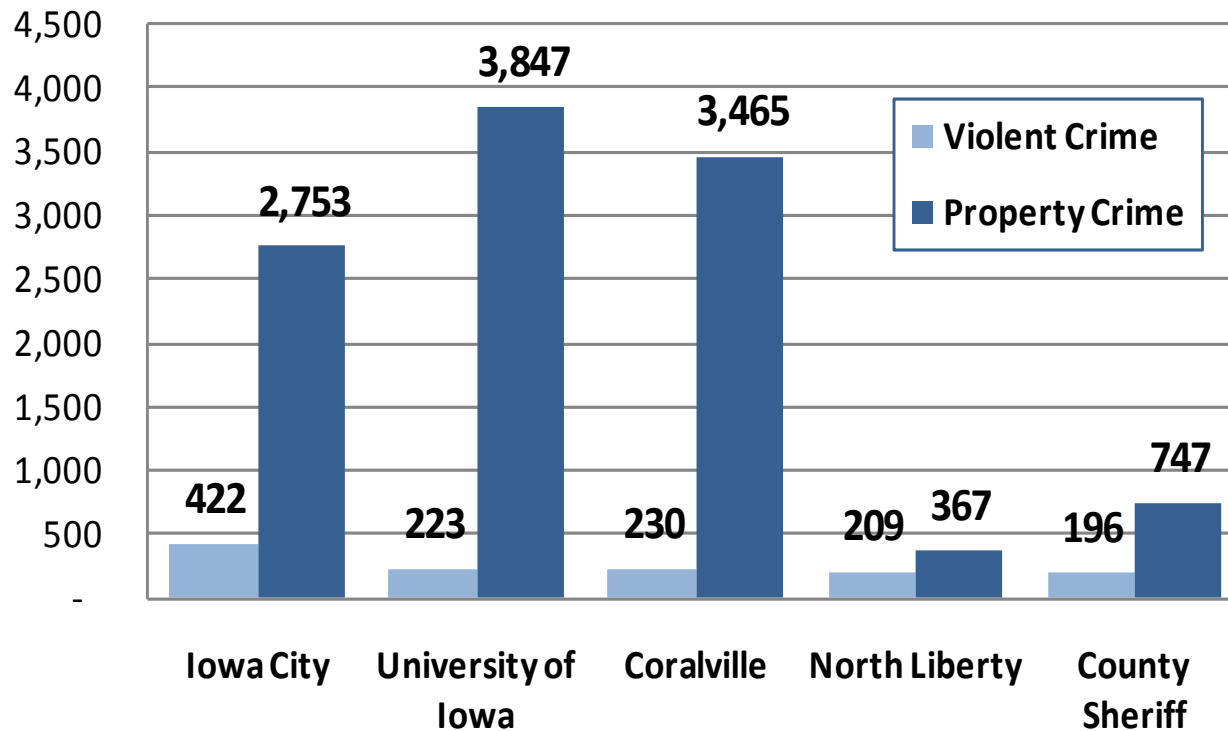

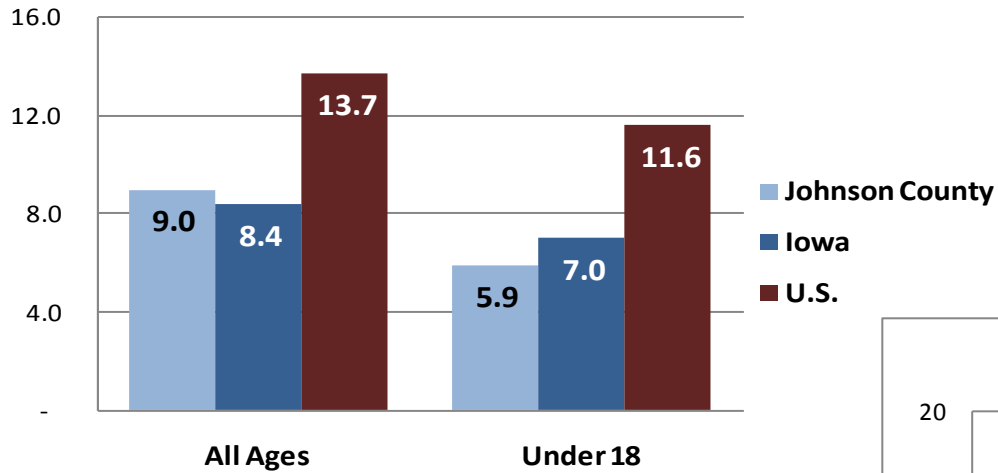

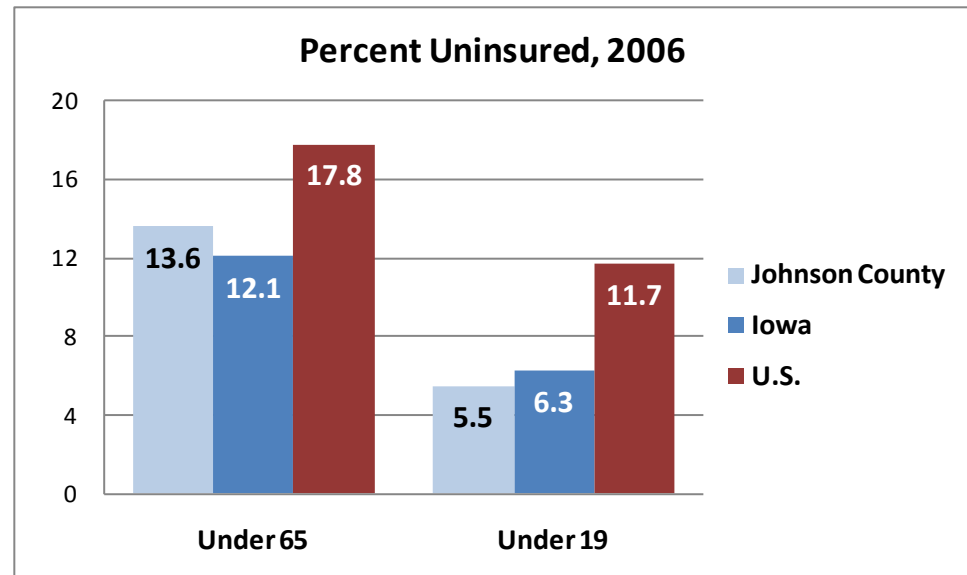

Percent Uninsured, 2000

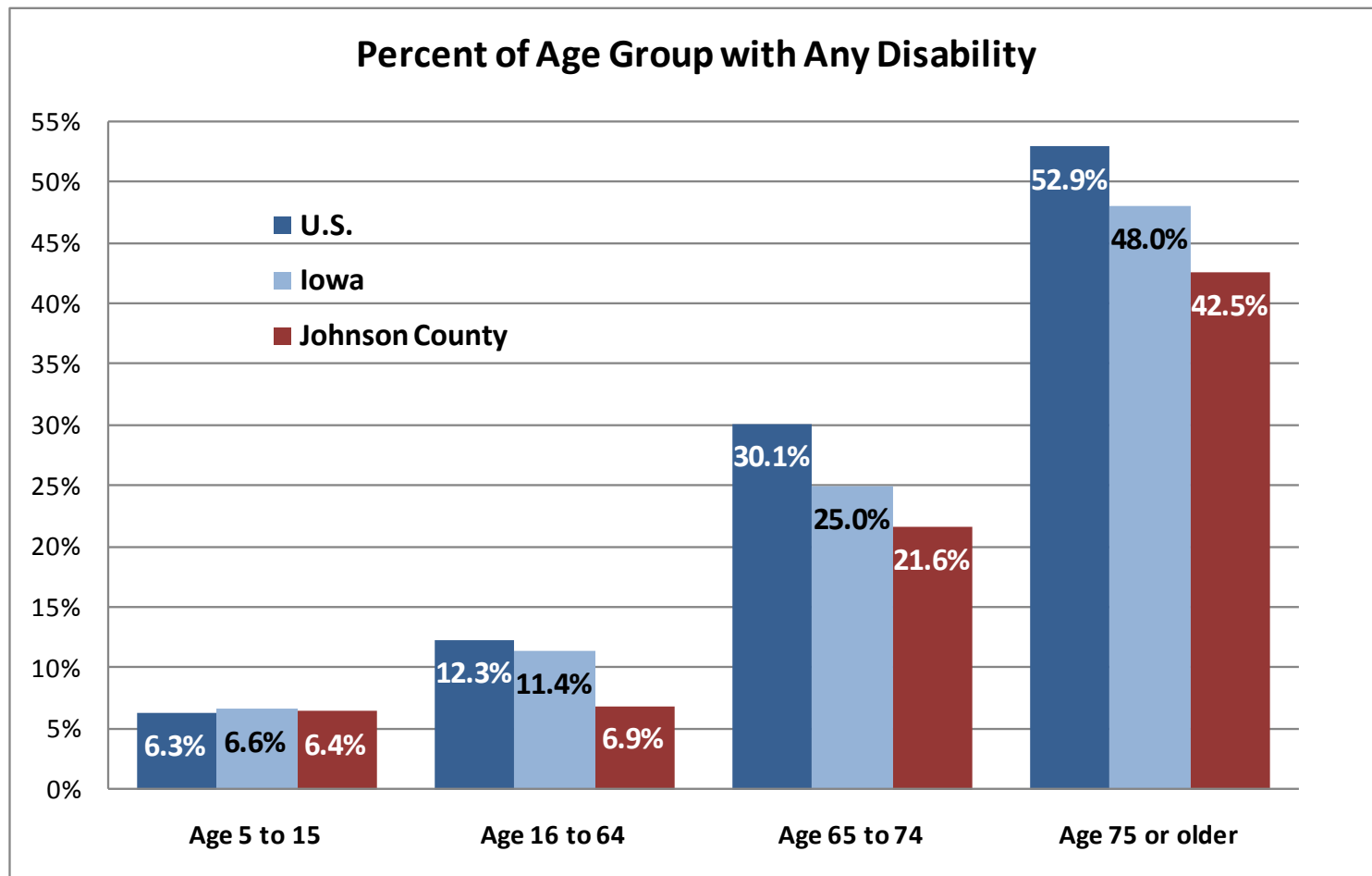


Percent Uninsured, 2006



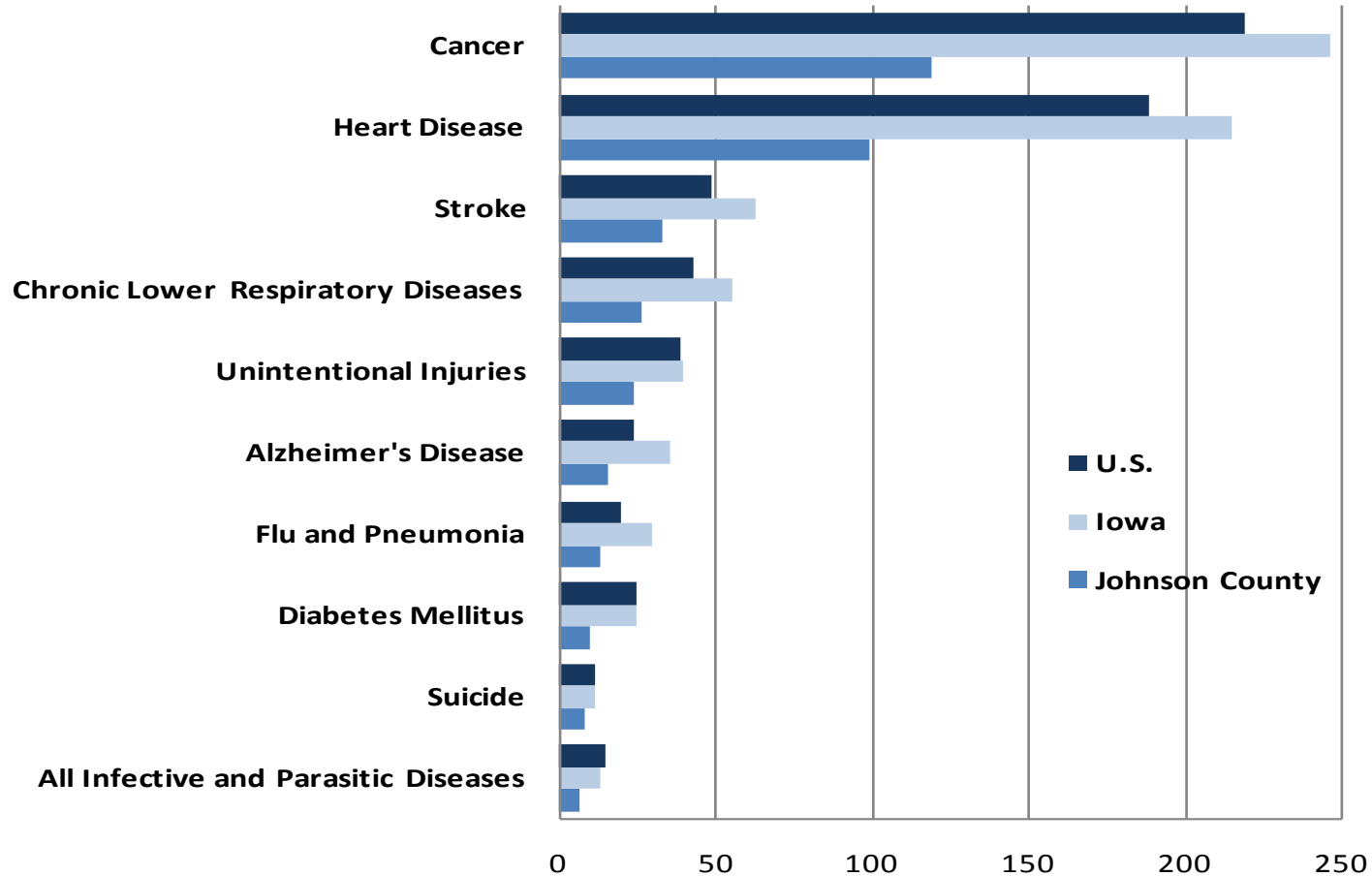

Disability: Prevalence among the Population, 2006-07



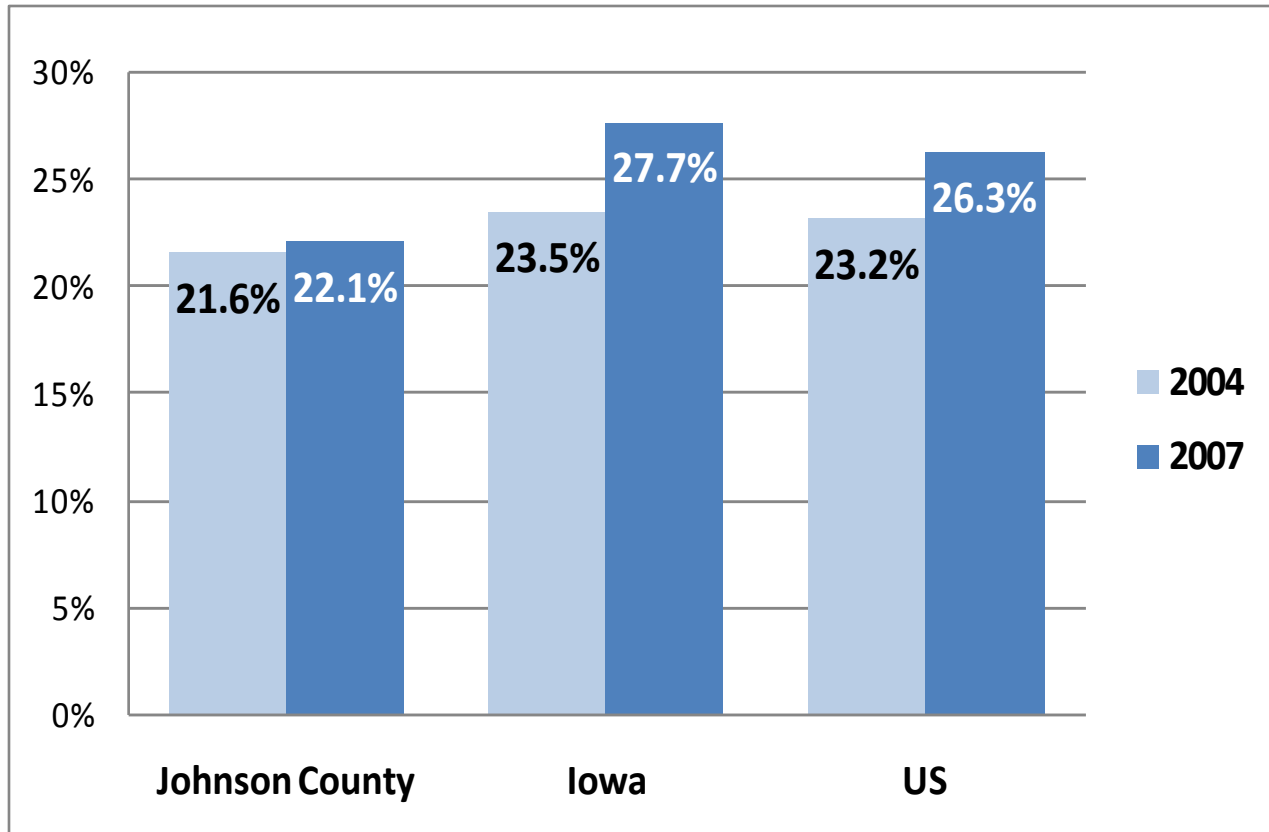
